<u>THEME</u>: The devil is weaker than your faith!

(<u>1 Peter 5:8-11</u>) "Be of sober *spirit*, be on the alert. Your adversary, the devil, prowls around like a roaring lion, seeking someone to devour. But resist him, firm in *your* faith, knowing that the same experiences of suffering are being accomplished by your brethren who are in the world. After you have suffered for a little while, the God of all grace, who called you to His eternal glory in Christ, will Himself perfect, confirm, strengthen *and* establish you. To Him *be* dominion forever and ever. Amen."

I. OUR PROWLING ENEMY - (v.8)

- A. (v.8) "Be of sober spirit" balancing life's important issues
- B. (v.8) "be on the alert" imperative command; "be watchful" or "stay awake"
- C. (v.8) "Your adversary" technical term meaning "legal opponent"; hostile enemy
- D. (v.8) "the devil" ('diabolos') the ruler of this world (c.f. John 12:31; 14:30; 16:11)
- E. (v.8) "prowls around" to roam around stealthily; in order to steal and destroy
- F. (v.8) "like a roaring lion" (2 Cor 2:11 "for we are not ignorant of his schemes")
- G. (v.8) "seeking someone to devour" means "to gulp down" referring to destroy

II. OUR POTENT FAITH - (v.9)

- H. (v.9) "But resist him" to take a stand against; (c.f. James 4:7)
- I. (v.9) "firm in your faith" "firm" is Greek word "stereos" English word: "stereo"
- J. (v.9) "knowing" speaks of intentional thought, not mere emotion
- K. (v.9) "that the same experiences of suffering" nothing new under the sun
- L. (v.9) "are being accomplished by your brethren" you are not alone in this!
- M. (v.9) "who are in the world" the devil is the ruler of this world

III. OUR POWERFUL REWARD - (v.10-11)

- N. (v.10) "After you have suffered for a little while" (c.f. Revelation 2:10)
- O. (v.10) "the God of all grace" (c.f. 2 Corinthians 1:3 "God of all comfort")

- P. (v.10) "who called you to His eternal glory in Christ" (i.e. when you believed)
- Q. (v.10) "will Himself" God will personally do this, even while the devil attacks!
- R. (v.10) "perfect" to bring to wholeness (c.f Philippians 1:6; James 1:4)
- S. (v.10) "confirm" to set fast; unmovable (c.f. 1 Corinthians 1:7-8)
- T. (v.10) "strengthen" to make sturdy; not shaky (c.f. Luke 22:32)
- U. (v.10) "and establish you" to lay as a foundation (c.f. Isaiah 9:7)
- V. (v.11) "To Him" all the glory goes to God alone
- W. (v.11) "be dominion" signifies strength, of God's ability to dominate
- X. (v.11) "forever and ever" the timeframe of God's domination
- Y. (v.11) "Amen" So be it; let it be so!

How to Defeat the Devil:

- 1. Be of sober spirit
- 2. Be on the alert

- 5. Knowing (the suffering of others)
- 6. Temporary personal suffering
- 7. God's Grace
