<u>THEME</u>: Avoid all ungodliness at all costs all the time.

READ TEXT: 2 Timothy 3:6-9

1 But realize this, that in the last days difficult times will come. 2 For men will be lovers of self, lovers of money, boastful, arrogant, revilers, disobedient to parents, ungrateful, unholy, 3 unloving, irreconcilable, malicious gossips, without self-control, brutal, haters of good, 4 treacherous, reckless, conceited, lovers of pleasure rather than lovers of God, 5 holding to a form of godliness, although they have denied its power; Avoid such men as these. 6 For among them are those who enter into households and captivate weak women weighed down with sins, led on by various impulses, 7 always learning and never able to come to the knowledge of the truth. 8 Just as Jannes and Jambres opposed Moses, so these men also oppose the truth, men of depraved mind, rejected in regard to the faith. 9 But they will not make further progress; for their folly will be obvious to all, just as Jannes's and Jambres's folly was also.

I. Avoid Ungodly Sinners - (review verses 1-5)

- A. "in the last days difficult times will come" (vs.1)
- B. People will increase in ungodly living (vs.2-4)
- C. They will masquerade a false religious exterior (vs.5a) (c.f. Matthew 7:15-20)
- D. Avoidance not association is the command (vs.5b)

II. Beware of Ungodly Leaders - (verses 6-7)

- A. Ungodly Leaders arise from the same group as in verses 1-5 ("among them")
 - c.f. Acts 20:28-30; 2 Peter 2:1; 2 Timothy 4:3-4
- B. Ungodly Leaders prey on the broken and unprotected (vs. 6)
- C. Ungodly Leaders attract people with the same sinful impulses they have (vs.6)
- D. Ungodly Leaders may grow in popularity, but not in truth (vs.7b)

III. Rejection of the Ungodly - (verses 8-9)

- A. "Jannes and Jambres" (not mentioned in the Old Testament)
- B. Ungodly teachers are in contrast to true Bible teachers (vs.8)
- C. Ungodly Leaders have no lasting part in true Christianity (vs.9)

- D. Ungodly Leaders are temporary hindrances (vs.9) c.f. Matthew 16:18
- E. Ungodly Leaders will be unmasked in due time (vs.9) c.f. Jude 1-25

POINTS OF CONSIDERATION:

- 1. Sinfulness is getting worse; both inside and outside of the church.
- 2. False teachers are men-pleasers who seek gain from their followers.
- 3. False teachers prey upon the weak, the unprotected, and the vulnerable.
- 4. They are many Judas Iscariot's in modern-day Christianity.
- 5. We must realize that the church is in spiritual warfare; a warfare that will intensify as Christ's second coming draws nearer.
- 6. We must be doctrinally discerning, evaluating every message against the truth of God's Word. ("Now these were more noble-minded than those in Thessalonica, for they received the Word with great eagerness, examining the Scriptures daily to see whether these things were so." Acts 17:11)
- 7. We must live pure and holy lifestyles, being vessels of honor for the Lord's good use.
- 8. We must be patient as God does His work around us and through us and to us.
- 9. Regardless of whatever ungodly influences are around us, nothing can take away our salvation!
- 10. Although we must avoid ungodliness, we are still ambassadors of Christ with a Great Commission mandate to share the gospel with sinners.

Discussion Questions:

- 1. Why is spiritual discernment so important for us today?
- 2. How can you determine if a "Christian Leader" is a false prophet or not? What are some of the criteria we should use to determine this?
- 3. Why is sinful living, particularly by those in the church, increasing at such an alarming rate, and what can we do about it?
- 4. What are some things you can do to help protect people who are broken and vulnerable, from false teaching and a lack of discernment?
- 5. Discuss a time in your life when you or someone close to you has been negatively influenced by false teaching and/or false prophets.
